Arrival and Reporting of Initial J-1 Physicians



What is Validation of Initial Arrival?

ECFMG, as a J-1 visa program sponsor, must notify the U.S. Department of State (DoS) of the arrival of all newly sponsored J-1 exchange visitor physicians by confirming each new J-1 physician's arrival in SEVIS



Specific documents evidencing arrival in J-1 status are required before a SEVIS record can be validated.

Who Needs to be Validated?



All foreign national physicians who have *newly* acquired J-1 visa status **must be validated.**



Foreign national physicians *continuing* under ECFMG sponsorship in the same or a different training program **do not require validation**.

Validation of Arrival

Upon arrival to the training program, J-1 physicians must provide the TPL with evidence of their J-1 visa status.

Evidence of J-1 status includes copies of:

- J-1 visa stamp in passport issued by U.S. Consulate, *unless* a Canadian citizen
- I-94 record showing J-1; D/S (Duration of Status)

Visa and Visa Status

- A *visa* is the physical stamp affixed to a passport page that permits a foreign national to enter the United States in a specific visa classification.
 - May only be obtained at U.S. consulates outside of the U.S.
 - Only required if applicant is physically outside U.S. and wishes to enter/reenter
 - Expiration of the visa in a passport will not affect a physician while he or she is maintaining J-1 visa status in the United States



Visas are not required of Canadian citizens entering the U.S. with a Canadian passport

Visa Stamp Issued by U.S. Consulate

ENTRY DOCUMENT ONLY

- Confirms:
 - Visa type/class
 - Number of entries
 - Single or multiple
 - Issue date
 - Expiration date for entry
 - May expire while in the U.S.



Visa and Visa Status (cont.)

- *Visa status* is the legal condition or manner under which a foreign national is present in the United States.
 - Indicates an individual's purpose for being in the U.S. and the objectives he or she is authorized to pursue, such as training, studying, or working
 - Reflected on Form I-94 (Entry/Departure Record), which is issued at the U.S.
 port of entry to every entering nonimmigrant

An ECFMG-sponsored physician's Form I-94 should always reflect "J-1" status with the notation of "D/S" (Duration of Status)

Exceptions to Visa Issuance



Citizens of Canada are not required to have a U.S. Consulate visa stamp



J-1 exchange visitors who **change visa status** within the U.S. through U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) will have a **Form I-797**, not a J-1 visa stamp in passport

I-94 Arrival/Departure Record

- When a foreign national enters the U.S., their I-94 record is automatically generated and is stored online
 - Previously, foreign nationals were issued paper I-94 cards, but CBP (U.S. Customs and Border Protection) now issues all I-94 records electronically
 - A physical stamp is still placed in the passport upon entry



A traveler's most recent I-94 record, as well as arrival/departure history, can be accessed on **CBP's I-94 Website**.



Example Form I-797

Form I-797 is a "Notice of Action" and is commonly referred to as an "Approval Notice." This form shows a change of status (CoS) to J-1 visa classification.

I-94 is also available on Form I-797 here

What to Upload for SEVIS Validation

Once an initial (not continuing or transferring) J-1 physician arrives in the United States, you are required to promptly complete and sign the <u>Validation of Initial</u> <u>Arrival in J-1 Status</u> form and upload it as a PDF through MyIntealth, with copies of the applicant's:

- 1. Form I-94 (Arrival/Departure Record) or Form I-797 (applicable if the applicant was approved for a change of status in the U.S. through USCIS)
 - J-1 physicians may print a copy of Form I-94 card at https://i94.cbp.dhs.gov/I94/#/home
- 2. J-1 visa page from the passport, if applicable (Canadian citizens do not have J visa stamp)

Once a J-1 physician's start date is validated, no changes can be made to the date.

Validation of Initial Arrival in J-1 Status

Information for Exchange Visitor (EV) Physicians

The initial arrival of each EV physician to the United States must be immediately validated by ECFMG® in the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS). Failure to provide timely reporting of arrival to the United States may invalidate your SEVIS status and negatively impact your ability to remain in the United States and/or affect future immigration benefits. Please note the following with respect to your arrival in the United States and ongoing maintenance of J-I status.

- Arrival to the U.S. in J-1 Visa Status: Work with the Training Program Liaison (TPL) at your host institution to complete this form and submit
 required documentation.
- Social Security Number (SSN): SEVIS validation is required to apply for a U.S. SSN; J-1 physicians must wait 11 business days after being validated
 in SEVIS before applying for an SSN. Validation status can be confirmed through Mylthealth. Validated records are marked "active." On the Social
 Security Card application, at the question about "citizenship," J-1 physicians should select "other."
- Maintenance of J-1 Status: Once in "active" J-1 status you are required, at minimum, to:
- » Follow all rules and regulations of the J-1 exchange visitor program
- » Notify ECFMG of any proposed change in your training plan
- » Respond promptly to all information requests initiated by ECFMG

Failure to comply with any of the above could result in termination of your sponsorship and associated J-1 status.

NOTE: All EV physicians must enter/begin the training program within 30 days of acquiring J-1 visa status.

Information For TPLs

Please work with each new/incoming EV physician to complete this form and provide required documentation to ECFMG as soon as possible following initial arrival in the United States. Once validated in SEVIS by ECFMG, the physician's program start date cannot be changed.

NOTE: All EV physicians must enter/begin the training program within 30 days of acquiring 1-1 visa status.

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

Communicate with EVSP!

- Is the contract still valid?
- Is the program willing to wait? If so, how long?
- Was the visa delayed or denied?

Delays in Start Date



J-1s *must* start training within 30 days of arrival to the United States

- Communication with Program Coordinators and Directors
 - When and why to notify the TPL

Applying for a Social Security Number

- Before applying for a Social Security Number (SSN), J-1s must:
 - 1. Wait 11 business days after being validated in SEVIS; AND
 - 2. Confirm validation by ECFMG of the SEVIS record (View validation status in MyIntealth using the search page "Validated Physicians" filter.)



Applying for an SSN *prior* to SEVIS validation may cause significant delays in issuance of the SSN

• J-1 applicants receive this info in the welcome email with "Information Sheet" sent by ECFMG after initial Form DS-2019 is issued

- Re-entry to the U.S. as a J-1 requires:
 - Travel validated Form DS-2019
 - J-1 visa in passport as issued by U.S. Consulate*
 - * Except for Canadian citizens
